

Haas Undergraduate Program Global Management Concentration (GMC) Information/Workbook



We encourage all students to participate in international study programs as a means of broadening their education and developing a global view of business. International study can be enlightening and fulfilling on many levels, but it requires organization and self-motivation. We believe the benefits are well worth the effort.

Global Management Concentration

The Haas Global Management Concentration is a rigorous program for those students truly dedicated to pursuing an internationally oriented education and career. This program encourages Haas students to study abroad, improve language skills, and pursue a variety of international business and area studies courses.

In recognition of the rigor of this program, the concentration will be noted on the final transcript and on a certificate from the Haas School of Business.

All course work for the GMC will need to be completed at UC Berkeley or abroad through either the Education Abroad Program (EAP) or any other UC-transferable program. College course work from accredited schools prior to enrollment at UC Berkeley may not apply.

The concentration has four components, they are:

1) International Study

At least one semester of full-time international study on the UC Education Abroad Program (EAP) or another UC-transferable program.

2) Language Study

Completion of the third year level of language at UCB (or equivalent)

3) International Business Courses

UGBA 178: International Business + 3 upper-division international business courses

4) Area Studies Courses

3 upper-division non-business courses (e.g. social science, humanities, etc)

How to "DECLARE" The Global Management Concentration:

You declare the GMC by completing the required courses and submitting the GMC worksheet to the study abroad advisor. Please email renee@haas.berkeley.edu no later than the last day of classes in the semester in which you intend to graduate.

The worksheet will be reviewed for approval. Upon approval, your information will be sent to the Registrar's office. The registrar will include the completion of the GMC on your transcript. Please note it will appear only in the "memorandum" section of the transcript, not on your diploma.
