Colin Boyle, MBA/MPP – Deputy Director at UCSF Global Health Sciences

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Colin is the first Deputy Director of UCSF Global Health Sciences (GHS), dedicated to improving health and reducing disease worldwide. Colin joined UCSF after 15 years with the Boston Consulting Group (BCG), where he was a partner and managing director leading many of the firm's social impact projects. Before BCG, he worked at Partnership for Organ Donation in Boston as a site team specialist and for Corporate Decisions in Boston as an associate. Colin has worked extensively in global health, business management and strategy development and is currently on the board of the Oakland Museum of California. He also teaches Social Impact Metrics and Strategic Management of Nonprofit Organizations at Haas.



Meaghan Campbell – Program Officer, Marine Conservation Initiative

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Meaghan has worked in the nonprofit sector for 15 years. Her current work in philanthropy at the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation focuses on bringing together diverse interests in British Columbia to resolve conflict and ensure a healthy ocean and sustainable communities. This involves making grants to indigenous communities, nonprofits and businesses to find durable solutions. Previously, she was at Conservation International, where she evaluated community-based conservation and economic development projects in the Philippines and Indonesia. Meaghan also taught middle school environmental education in Missouri, Indiana and North Carolina, the latter through a fellowship with the National Science Foundation. She facilitated a marine conservation funder working group in the Consultative Group on Biological Diversity. Meaghan also served on the Emerging Practitioners in Philanthropy's San Francisco Bay Area Steering Committee. She now sits as Board Secretary for the Canadian Environmental Grantmakers Network and Board Vice President for the Bay Area Young Survivors, while also volunteering for Imerman's Angels and Upwardly Global.

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Lynne joined Marts & Lundy as a senior consultant in 2000 with more than five years of consulting experience in her own practice and with another national consulting firm. He has held multiple board seats including Habitat for Humanity Greater San Francisco, Mission Economic Development Agency, and an appointment to the San Francisco Private Industry Council, by then-mayor Gavin Newsom.
